Our work with schools is looking very different this academic year. Whilst we are still unable to deliver to groups in person in school, Beverley Schools Christian Trust is still actively contributing to school life. We asked all our schools what support they would like from us and tailored our resources to their requests of assembly ideas and RE support - Festivals and Celebrations.

During the Autumn Term, a whole range of creative and tailored resources benefited hundreds of Primary children. PrayerSpace materials for use in classrooms enabled children to explore *Thankfulness* and *Perseverance*, plus a special Advent series during December. Pre-written assemblies were gratefully received, enabling children to lead their classes in worship. Fortunately, our Christmas 2020 Advent resources were ready prepared before lockdown, and then distributed with RE-focused lessons to accompany them.

Some benefits of tailoring our support are stronger relationships with local schools, together with opportunities to devise and develop new materials.



Adam and Petra from *Label of Love* have been working with Cathy from *BSCT* to produce a new *Wellbeing* series for primary schools, complete with videos and materials which teaching assistants or teachers can use with small groups of children.

"On behalf of us all at Beverley St. Nicholas Primary, I would like to thank everyone for all their hard work in preparing resources during this difficult time. It is all especially useful just now, when children's emotions are all mixed up. We have been able to pick up the individual packs and use them for different circumstances. Before Christmas, some children in one of my classes were feeling worried about not seeing their family. I picked up one of the packs I'd used before when we could meet for SPACE. It was really for remembering soldiers and wrapping a peg in wool whilst remembering what soldiers had done for us. We used the peg and thought about our family whilst wrapping the wool around. We all said a prayer at the end. This was very helpful."

Easter resources comprised prayer spaces to be set up in classrooms. We made these reusable so they could be used in several classes. Our Lent lunchtime club programme was adapted into RE lessons with bible stories and activities. The children valued the hands-on aspect of these lessons.

During the Spring Term, we prepare Summer Transition sessions for Year 6 pupils to be used alongside *It's Your Move* booklets (Scripture Union) kindly purchased for each child with grants from The James Graves Trust of Beverley Minster. Schools are grateful for such support from outside organisations in such challenging times.

In September our Play Worker, Karen Eyre, left BSCT to move to new role. Cathy Beynon furloughed until November - continues in her role coordinating Primary work.





#### From Peter Spencer:

"BSCT has maintained contact with East Riding College and provided an introductory video for inclusion in the virtual Freshers Week at the start of the current academic year. This briefly explained the role of our tutorials and the kind of subjects we explore, such as mutual respect and destiny. As much of the material is topical, all of the modules have been updated in the light of recent current affairs. Whilst willing to support online activities, none have taken place under the present constraints, and we're hoping to resume normal faceto-face sessions next term.
